

WHO'S WHO - THE PLAYWRIGHTS



RICHARD CASTLE (The Influencer)

Richard Castle is a playwright, lyricist and songwriter. *Housewarming Party* will be seen in the upcoming "Bewitching" festival in 2021. *Love Stings*, a new musical, was commissioned by Northern Sky Theater and will have its world premiere in 2022. *Virtual Happy Hour* was produced by both Theater Resources Unlimited and Left Edge Theater in 2021. *Oklahoma In Wisconsin*, his 1950s-style family musical, premiered at Northern Sky Theater in 2017. *The Angel of Painted Post* was selected by Stephen Schwartz for the ASCAP Musical Theater Workshop in Los Angeles. His comedy song *Mr. Whiskers* was a semi-finalist in the International

Songwriting Competition in 2020. Other plays include *Vacuity, Everything Must Go, Anne's Ashes*, and *Cabbages & Kings*. Other musicals include *Bloodline* and *L.A. Carmen* (L.A. ANDREA FLECK CLARDY (Safekeeping)

Andrea Fleck Clardy is a Boston playwright and activist. Her short plays and monologues have been widely produced and included in numerous "Best of..." anthologies, published by Smith and Kraus, Applause, and New World Theatre, most recently *Laughter Is the Best Medicine: Forty-five 5-minute Plays in the Time of Coronavirus* edited by Debbie Lamedman (Smith & Kraus, 2021). She won the Promising Playwright Award and was a semi-finalist for the Eugene O'Neill Conference, a finalist for the Princess Grace Award, and twice for the Heideman Award. Full-length shows include *Hide and Seek*, with music by Clark Gesner (Hangar Theatre, Ithaca NY), and *Job Loss Figure* (Colonial Players, Annapolis MD). Her publications also include a

JACK SEAMUS CONLEY (Viktoria's Letter)

Jack Séamus Conley (he/him) is a proud neurodivergent, disabled, and queer/transgender playwright and director located in the Seattle area. He holds a BA in Psychology and Theatre Arts from the University of Puget Sound, and between the years of 2017-2019 took a break from theater to obtain a Masters of Health Administration from Columbia University, after which he got back into the performing arts scene (which has felt like a breath of fresh air). Still fairly new to the playwright scene, Jack largely draws on a mixture of history, literature, and lived experiences to create his work. He's also inspired by psychology and interpersonal relationships,

and often combines dramatic and semi-abstract realism, depending on the piece. JANE ALLYSON – Artistic Director, Technical Operator



AMY SKALINDER. COMMUNITY HOUSE PRESIDENT


